Strathcona Gardens Program Updates

At the last meeting of the Strathcona Gardens I was pleased to see the new programs that have been developed working with the School District.

For Grade 3 - up to 540 students will be able to attend an 8 week swim program. This program was developed to meet the needs of the community and to recognize that there are times when after school events are not always easy to attend or can be accommodated in parent schedules.

<u>Grade 10-12 Carihi Swim and Life Saving Program</u> for up to 24 students. This will allow students to achieve Canadian Swim Patrol, Standard First Aid, Bronze Medallion and Bronze Cross Certificates.

<u>Cedar Elementary School Skate and Swim for grades 3,4,5</u>. This will be 3 times per week for 24 sessions of Skate and Swim Lessons. This will ensure all those in Campbell River and Area D have an opportunity to learn how to skate and swim.
